WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES



A visit to Jamaica in January by a World Council of Churches (WCC) delegation saw them conducting workshops. On January 16th & 17th, 2025 the workshops were held at Ridgemount United Church in Mandeville and focused on Social Justice Advocacy. This covered areas including combating Sexual and Gender Based Violence, Racism and fighting for Climate Justice with faith driven strategies.

On January 20,2025 CANACOM hosted their workshop via zoom platform. The subject was *Climate Change and Litigation*. An article summarizing the event was published in the WCC News on February 6,2025 under the heading [WCC, with Churches in the Caribbean and North America, debuts training on Climate Litigation]. Some remarks given by the EIM Secretary include the fact that all CANACOM member churches are aware of the issues, but more action needs to take place. She also mentioned that a handbook on Climate Litigation will soon be published by WCC.

Earth Medic/Earth Nurse

A webinar collaboration on "How to build Alliance between Health Professionals and People of Faith for a better Climate" was held on March 12, 2025 at 5pm Jamaica time. The purpose of the webinar was to raise awareness, foster collaboration, inspire action and build capacity.

The moderators were Dr Carl James Hospedales and Rev. Kimberly Ramlochan. Rev. Diana de Graven, Chair of CANACOM made a presentation



HYDROPONIC PROJECT

The idea of implementing a hydroponics system at the Christoforus Internaat was agreed during a discussion between Rev. Denyse Rattansingh-Atwarie, Minister, Church of Scotland in Trinidad (COST) Ms. Ayanna Leacock, Young Adults in Mission (YAM) representative from COST, Mrs. Jennifer Martin, Education in Mission Secretary. CANACOM embraced the idea, and the relevant approvals were granted from the Administrative Committee. The intention was to have the system installed during the YAM camp, July 2024. However, emerging from consultations among CANACOM, the Reformed Church in Suriname (RCS), Ms. Leacock and Christoforus Internaat, it was decided that Ms. Leacock would return to Suriname in April 2025 to spearhead the construction of the system.

The project team included Rev. Diana de Graven, Chair of CANACOM, members of the RCS, Mrs. Monica Biljhout, Director Christoforus Internaat, boys and girls from the institution and Mr. Helmond Proeve, a local hydroponics specialist. Everly Jade, granddaughter of Mrs. Henriette Pierpont Wijnaldum, Treasurer of the RCS, was the youngest member of the work team. Her presence brought a refreshing boost to the team's morale.



Mr. Proeve started the repairs to the greenhouse ahead of Ms. Leacock's arrival, to ensure that the project stayed on track for the scheduled completion timeline of two days. The entire system consists of approximately 624 lots (the individual growing areas or plant locations within system) for overall plant production. Throughout the construction process children were taught how to use the tools assisting with hole drilling, smoothening the pipes, and cutting and placing the mesh cloth around the shed.

The director and children of the institution were trained in the effective use of the system and were presented with Certificates of Participation.

Mr. Kenneth Vasilda installed the electrical unit for the hydroponics system and assisted with explaining the complexities of the system to the users, as well as, how to guarantee its stability.





COUNCIL MEETING May 15-21, 2025

Hosted by: Guyana Presbyterian Church Guyana Congregational Union Presbyterian Church of Guyana



The Council Meeting was convened in Georgetown, Guyana, May 15-21, 2025, under the Theme: "Creation Laments: Journeying With A Liberating Hope Towards Peace." The undergirding Scripture was Romans 5:1-5.

The Opening Worship Service was held at Burns Memorial Presbyterian Church, Georgetown. Rev. Dr. Brenda Kirton Harewood, General Secretary of the Guyana Missionary Baptist Union, was the Guest Preacher. The Service was attended by delegates from CANACOM member churches, Honourable Priya Manickchand, Minister of Education for Guyana, Mrs. Janet McConnell, Mission Secretary-Social Justice & Caribbean Region, Council for World Mission (CWM), other specially invited guests and members of the host churches.

Ms. Konyo Addo presented the delegates with an introduction to Guyana through a brief historical and geographical sketch of the country. The presentation commenced with an invitation to explore Guyana beyond conventional historical accounts, embracing its rich oral traditions, folklore, poetry, and music. Hilton Hemerding's folk song, "Beautiful Guyana" was used to set the tone for understanding the nation's unique identity.

Dr. Chetwynd Osborne delivered a presentation on the *Extractive Industries/Climate Change And Their Effects On The Guyana Context.* Dr. Osborne is a lecturer in the Department of Earth and Environmental Science, University of Guyana. He has special interest in biodiversity, conservation and sustainable land management, and actively engages in research in these fields.

- Integral Links To Climate Justice.




BIBLE SUDIES LAMENT, JUSTICE & PEACE, HOPE
